Dear Hinckley Residents,

Well, here we are starting another great year in Hinckley Town. As I reminisce about the history of Hinckley Town, I reflect back to 1946 when Hinckley Town won the Utah, Centennial Cleanup contest and was awarded a trophy recognizing Hinckley as the cleanest town in Utah. The Hinckley Town motto was, "To make the Desert Bloom". Wow, what a motto, passion of residents, and successful accomplishment. In 2013, I would like to see this image of Hinckley Town restored with everyone's help along with neighbors helping neighbors. Our annual clean-up day is on May 4, 2013 starting with breakfast served from 8:00 – 9:30 am at the Hinckley Fire Station, courtesy of the Hinckley Lions Club. I encourage all residents to come and enjoy a wonderful hot breakfast to start off a productive day of cleaning up our yards, properties and town. The fire department will be burning around town, so if you need help burning or hauling off debris please call the town office at 864-3522 to make a request.

Our annual dog licensing and vaccination clinic was held in February. If you were unable to attend this clinic and have not licensed your dog, please go to the office and license your dog. The Town Council is in the process of amending our dog licensing ordinance to change the annual dog licensing period from the end February to the end of April in hope that more dog owners will participate in the licensing and vaccination clinic.

We are still collecting scrap metal (Donate to Create) to help with the cost of our new park restrooms. We have had all of the cinder block, plumbing fixtures, and plumbing pipe donated for our park restrooms. If you would like to help with the labor to build the park restrooms or donate money, please call the town office and let us know.

As you can see from the enclosed event flyer, we have some great events planned for 2013. We start with the Miss Hinckley Pageant and Hinckley Rodeo Queen Contest. Please come out and support the young ladies competing for these titles.

Then, don't miss our summer series in the park beginning with the Hot Dog Roast on May 30 at 6:00 p.m. and ending with our Hamburger Fry and Potluck from your garden on September 18 at 5:30 p.m. We will have local entertainment for each summer event in the park.

Our celebration is going to be held on July 19 and 20. We will start Friday, July 19, at 7:00 p.m. with the JUNIOR RODEO, and RODEO at 8.00 p.m. Then, on the 20th we will begin with the early morning SALUTE at dawn, Hinckley Lions Club FUN RUN at 8:00 a.m., PARADE at 9:30 a.m., PARK PROGRAM at 11:00 a.m., followed up with our DINNER and HOOTENANNY in the park. If you purchase your meal ticket in advance, the cost is \$3.50 per meal or \$5.00 in the park. Then back to the rodeo grounds at 7:00 p.m. for the JUNIOR RODEO and RODEO at 8.00 p.m. After the rodeo on Saturday, July 20 there will be a STREET DANCE in front of the park until 12:00 p.m. and it's **free**.

We are trying something new this summer by hosting six Gymkhana nights at the rodeo grounds with events like barrels, poles, goat tying, flag race, musical horseshoes, potato race, etc. Sign-up begins at 6:30 p.m., with age groups: 0-8 (\$1.00 per event), 9-13 (\$ 2.00 per event), 14-18 (\$3.00 per event), and open (\$5.00 per event). The Gymkhanas will be held on the following dates: June 13, June 27, July 11, July 25, August 8, and August 22, so plan on bringing your horse and having some fun.

Our final event for 2013 will be our Park Christmas Lighting on Saturday, December 7, at 6:00 p.m. Bring your kids and grandkids to see Santa and the park decorations and lights, while enjoying a cup of hot chocolate and a doughnut.

As your mayor, I hope you will come and be a part of all our activities and enjoy your spring, summer, fall and winter in Hinckley. Remember, Town Council meetings are held on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month at 7:00 p.m., feel free to come and watch your Council work.

I want to thank you for supporting me. Please help us make it another great year in Hinckley!!!

Hello Hinckley Residents,

As the maintenance supervisor for Hinckley Town I want to take the time to address and answer some of the concerns I get and how we can all help to correct them.

- ANIMALS AT LARGE There is no leash law in Hinckley; but, it is illegal to let your dog run freely around Hinckley and through your neighbor's property. I understand dogs like to get out and run and I encourage you to let them do so, but please be where you can see your dog during these times. Since we have so many unlicensed dogs running at large, I plan to start issuing citations to the owners of these dogs. I do not like the fact that it has come to this; however it is not fair for those residents who license their dogs and keep them contained. The current penalty fee for the pickup of an unlicensed dog is \$50.00, the cost of a dog license is \$5.00 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$10.00 for a female or male dog, which seems like a \$40 dollar gamble. To be honest, I know where most of the unlicensed dogs reside and I have turned a blind eye to them often because I'm in the middle of something else more pressing. However, it's to the point where instead of chasing your dog all over town, issuing a citation will be the way to fix this problem.
- OVERGROWN TREES AND WEEDS Spring is here and overgrown trees and weeds are a big concern to many of our residents. Due to the many trees in Hinckley Town, the maintenance department spends much time and money whether it is cleaning up tree debris caused from weather storms, trimming trees creating a public safety hazard, or spraying herbicides to control weeds. At this time, I want to remind residents that the trees, shrubs, plants, and weeds in the right-of-ways adjoining your property are NOT the property of Hinckley Town we have a right-of-way on your property. Therefore, if you have trees, shrubs, or weeds in the right-of-way, it is your responsibility to maintain the right-of-way and make sure this area is in compliance with the Hinckley Town Zoning Ordinances. Currently, I am in the process of surveying the town and I will be sending letters to residents in violation of the zoning ordinance.
- YELLOW WATER At our water treatment plant we use a chemical called Ferric Chloride also known as FeCl3 which is an iron compound that helps pull arsenic out of the water. Every now and then we see traces of this chemical come into the system turning the water a yellow color. In recent years we have experienced yellow water when we flush the fire hydrants due to the fact that excess FeCl3 tends to get trapped in the lines where water does not flow though the loop system. If you are experiencing yellow water, please let your water run for 10-15 minutes because in all cases thus far, the water clears up. Although this water is very dirty looking is only high in iron and is not toxic. If you are having problems with your water, please feel free to call me.


On Thursday, May 23, these young ladies competed in public speaking,



Marshals of the Day for the 24th celebration are Gale and Natalie Bennett.

Gale Bennett was born in Meadow to Phyllis Talbot and Vaun Bennett. His parents moved to Hinckley when he was about three years old. Gale was the second of four boys and the caboose is a beautiful sister.

Gale went to school in Hinckley until the school was moved to Delta, where he went for two years and then graduated. He also went to the College of Southern Utah in Cedar for two years where he graduated with an associate degree.

Natalie was raised in Trout Creek. Her parents were Nathan L. and Myrta Hale. Natalie came to Delta for her high school years to finish school.

Gale and Natalie met in Delta and were married in 1959. They had four children, three beautiful daughters—

Debra, Elizabeth, and Galyn; then handsome Wade came along.

Gale has always been involved with livestock and farming, he also shod horses. He worked at Brush Wellman for six years. Gale then went to work for Homer Petersen training his quarter horses.

He was the first person in Utah to officially qualify a AAA running horse into The American Quarter Horse record books. This happened in July 1968 with Lee Bar Patty and Don Be Gone. Gale then went to work for the Bureau of Land Management for six years as the Wild Horse Specialist.

Gale's love was and still is horses. His brother Phil asked him to go with him and train thoroughbred horses, so he left the BLM and trained with Phil. He trained horses at Denver, Phoenix and Omaha.

When the company he worked for cut back on the horses Gale came back to Hinckley, went to work for the BLM as the wild horse specialist again out of the Fillmore Field Office. He had worked for a total of 23 years when he retired.

Gale and Natalie love living in Hinckley and were happy to raise their children here most of the time.

They have five grandsons, three granddaughters and five great-grand-children. Family is important to them. Gale's grandfather, George Talbot, was very much a part of the Hinckley Celebration on the 24th of July.

They are very surprised and happy to have been chosen for the Marshals of the-Day for the 24th celebration.














Annual Drinking Water Quality Report Hinckley Town

We're pleased to present to you this year's Annual Drinking Water Quality Report. This report is designed to inform you about the quality of the water and services we deliver to you every day. Our constant goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources. We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Our water source has been determined to be ground water that comes from a deep well.

The Drinking Water Source Protection Plan for Hinckley Town is available for your review. It contains information about source protection zones, potential contamination sources and management strategies to protect our drinking water. Our sources have been determined to have a low potential for any contamination sources. We have also developed management strategies to further protect our sources from contamination. Please contact us if you have questions or concerns about our source protection plan.

There are many connections to our water distribution system. When connections are properly installed and maintained, the concerns are very minimal. However, unapproved and improper piping changes or connections can adversely affect not only the availability, but also the quality of the water. A cross connection may let polluted water or even chemicals mingle into the water supply system when not properly protected. This not only compromises the water quality but can also affect your health. So, what can you do? Do not make or allow improper connections at your homes. Even that unprotected garden hose lying in the puddle next to the driveway is a cross connection. The unprotected lawn sprinkler system after you have fertilized or sprayed is also a cross connection. When the cross connection is allowed to exist at your home, it will affect you and your family first. If you'd like to learn more about helping to protect the quality of our water, call us for further information about ways you can help.

This report shows our water quality and what it means to you our customer. Hinckley Town routinely monitors for constituents in our drinking water in accordance with the Federal and Utah State laws. The following table shows the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1st to December 31st, 2012. All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some constituents. It's important to remember that the presence of these constituents does not necessarily pose a health risk.

In the following table you will find many terms and abbreviations you might not be familiar with. To help you better understand these terms we've provided the following definitions:

Non-Detects (ND) - laboratory analysis indicates that the constituent is not present.

ND/Low - High - For water systems that have multiple sources of water, the Utah Division of Drinking Water has given water systems the option of listing the test results of the constituents in one table, instead of multiple tables. To accomplish this, the lowest and highest values detected in the multiple sources are recorded in the same space in the report table.

Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/l) - one part per million corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000.

Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter (ug/l) - one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

Parts per trillion (ppt) or Nanograms per liter (nanograms/l) - one part per trillion corresponds to one minute in 2,000,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000,000.

Picocuries per liter (pCi/L) - picocuries per liter is a measure of the radioactivity in water.

Millirems per year (mrem/yr) - measure of radiation absorbed by the body.

Nephelometric Turbidity Unit (NTU) - nephelometric turbidity unit is a measure of the clarity of water. Turbidity in excess of 5 NTU is just noticeable to the average person.

Action Level (AL) - the concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.





Carl Theobald's tour as Sheriff

Some Millard County Sheriffs' History

by Dean Draper

In 1883, Sheriff (George) Wise Cropper was with a posse rounding up train robbers in the mountains of Millard County's west desert. A little over 40 years later, Sheriff Carl Theobald of Hinckley was pursuing lawbreakers across the county.

Sheriff Theobald created a diary of his activities for the years 1927 and 1928 in the form of his reimbursement log. He noted his travels and expenses on an almost daily basis for the two years.

The log came into the possession of Gary Hudson of Scipio who donated it to the Sheriff's Office. It is now displayed in the glass case in the Sheriff's Office in Fillmore. Before it became a display piece it was shared with the Millard County Chronicle Progress. There are almost daily entries in the log. Some things remain the same over the years. Below are some entries from the log we thought readers might find to be of interest.

Jan. 3, 1927 - Went to Fillmore and swore in.

Jan. 5 - Called over from Fillmore on burglers via Delta and Hinckley to Oasis and Return to Hinckley looking for clues.

Jan. 8 - Made a trip to --- Ranch to make a check for stolen goods and return.

Jan. 18 - Up to Deseret Oasis and Delta Just looking around. While at Delta had to serve and attachment and close up the Delta Motor Car Company.

Mar. 21 - Hinckley to Fillmore via of Delta. In Delta telegrams to sheriff in Los Angeles and Earl Elmer. To Fillmore to check up on fee books.

Mar. 23 - Hinckley to Oasis and Delta and return getting information and telegrams on Brickert and making arrangements for expense money and back to Oasis and return.

Fare to L.A. \$23.40

Sleeper \$3.00

Dinner at Milford 75¢

Supper at Caliente 75¢

Mar. 24 - San Barnanido (Bernadino)

Mar. 26 - Supper on train \$2.50

Mar. 28 - Called over to Delta on chicken theft.

Mar. 30 Mileage from Hinckley to Deseret & Oasis investigating chicken theft also investigating a still that is supposed to be down below Deseret.

April 2 Mileage to Marshal Tract and return to Hinckley to oasis and return to Delta and Oasis information on chicken theft and return to Descret to dance and return arrested----- for the possession of moon shine whiskey. Looking for moon shine peddlers.

April 23 - mileage to Woodrow to Dance called by ----- on moon shine suspicion. To Deseret over on tire theft.

April 24 - ...Out to South tract looking for Drunks and partys.

April 25 - ... Sutherland out on theft of callor (collar)stolen from Sugar Factory.

April 28 - ... from Hinckley to above Lynndyl and all over. Located still....

May 10 stolen car from Spanish Fork....

June 18...on to Lake Shore to dance....

July 5 ...to Fillmore to attend commissioners meeting and out to Lake Shore to dance....

Sept. 5 ... Hinckley to Greenwood to investigate car wreck. To Lynndyl making investigation in the drunker and knifing row.

Nov. 12 ...Called out to Woodrow to attend dance and keep order. In Delta getting information on the theft



of sheep

Nov. 19...Still investigating Blackmailing case against

Dec. 10...meet County Commissioners on Budget appropriation for the year 1928

Dec. 16...to Rockwell's ranch Searching with federal probation officer for stills

March 8, 1928 - ...making further investigation of the seed theft case from Fillmore and Pahyant

March 9 - ...to Holden to investigate and to have identified the party selling stole seed. Called from Fillmore to railroad station in the death of Also made investigation as to liquor in McCornick.

April 5 ...called up to investigate the robbery of five different places in Delta

May 23 ...out to Lake Shore searching for whom was drowned in Reservoir near Lake Shore
